



China's solar power generation targets

Will China achieve its wind and solar power targets in 2024?

TANG DEHONG/FOR CHINA DAILY China is on course to achieve its wind and solar power targets despite global economic uncertainties, and is poised to install more than 200 million kilowatts of new solar and wind capacity in 2024, six years ahead of the initial plan, according to a think tank.

Will China build more solar power this year?

The country will build as much new solar capacity this year as the total installed capacity in the U.S., according to the Centre for Research on Energy and Clean Air. Fossil fuels now make up less than half of China's total installed capacity for power generation.

What is China's role in solar energy expansion?

China's pivotal role in solar energy expansion is underscored by its massive investment and robust government support. Leading the world in solar production, China hosts several of the largest solar farms globally, including the notable Tengger Desert Solar Park, capable of powering 600,000 homes.

When will China reach 200GW of wind & solar capacity?

By the end of April 2024, China's total installed wind + solar capacity reached 112.9 GW. If this pace sustains or accelerates in the rest of the year, China will achieve its 200 GW of installed wind and solar capacity by 2030, target this year, 6 years ahead of time.

How can solar power be used in China?

These bases, a combination of vast solar arrays and wind farms, are to be connected to markets in eastern China through high-speed transmission lines. The projects take advantage both of high solar radiation in the desert and large amounts of cheap, available land.

How much solar power does China have in 2023?

China added almost twice as much utility-scale solar and wind power capacity in 2023 than in any other year. By the first quarter of 2024, China's total utility-scale solar and wind capacity reached 75.8 GW, though data from China Electricity Council put the total capacity, including distributed solar, at 112.0 GW.

By 2030, it's projected that China will account for more than half of the global renewable energy capacity, pivoting significantly away from its previous dependence on coal. This dramatic upswing is fuelled by the country's heavy investment in solar technology, positioning it to represent 60% of the upcoming renewable projects globally.

China's solar photovoltaic (PV) capacity reached 609.5 GW in 2023, while its onshore and offshore wind capacity stood at 408.1 GW and 37.7 GW, respectively. The country is on track to surpass its 2030 target by a significant margin, achieving this milestone five years ahead of schedule in 2025.
